AAP names 10 candidates for Assembly polls

NEARLY FIVE months ahead of the Gujarat Assembly elections, the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) announced its first list of candidates for 10 of the 182 constituencies Tuesday.

The list features Bhambhai Chaudhary from the Doodar seat in Banaskantha, Jagmal Vala from Somnath in Gir Somnath, Arjun Rathva from the Chhota Udepur seat, Sagar Rabari from Becharji in Mehsana, Vashram Saghaiya from the Rajkot Rural seat, Ram Dhakul from Karmali in Surat, Shival Barasia from Rajkot South, Sudhir Vaghani from Gariyadar in Bhavnagar, Rajendra Solanki from Bardoli in Surat and Omprakash Tiwari from Naroda in Ahmedabad. With this, the AAP has become the first political party to announce candidates for the polls scheduled for December this year. The party has announced the list in advance so that the candidates can reach out to the people of their constituencies and tell them about our vision," said AAP Gujarat president Gopal Italia at a press conference in Ahmedabad Tuesday.

The move comes a day after

AAP national convenor and Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal held a rally in Varad of Gir Somnath announcing "job guarantee" for all unemployed youths of Gujarat if chosen to power.

"For the first time in the history of Gujarat, a party is announcing its candidates four to five months ahead of the elections. AAP is the honest alternative which the people of Gujarat were looking for all these years. The manner in which the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) and the Congress have been ruling Gujarat in the past several decades, the AAP has arrived to fight them with all the strength. Recently, we expanded our party in three stages in order to ensure that we reach every household in Gujarat," Italia added.

Congratulating the candidates, Italia said party Vice-President Chaudhary has been with the party since its inception days in Gujarat and has been striving hard all these years. Similarly, another Vice-President Jagmal Vala has been selected for the Somnath seat as he has been working towards the health care of the poor through his hospitals and schools. Our Adhivasi community leader Arjun Rathva, a former college professor, who has been fighting for the rights of tribal communities has also been given an opportunity from Chhota Udepur," he said.

Rabari has been chosen for Becharji as he has been fighting for farmers' rights to save their lands from government projects. "We have also given an opportunity to our youth leader Ram Dhakul from Surat," Italia said.

Sub-inspector booked for 'accepting' bribe of Rs 1.3 lakh

THE GUJARAT Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB) Tuesday detained a police sub-inspector with Surat Police for allegedly accepting a bribe of Rs 1.3 lakh.

According to Gujarat ACB officials, PSI Jaideep Singh Rajput with Puna police station and his aide Jaiuddin Salyed were detained after they were allegedly caught red-handed accepting the bribe amount Tuesday.

The ACB officials said that the sub-inspector demanded the bribe amount from a travel firm owner in a prohibition case after a police seized illicit liquor from a luxury bus owned by the firm.

"The accused police officer had called the staff of the travel company and threatened to book him under the prohibition case. The accused police officer then asked for the name of company owner and threatened to book him as well under the prohibition case. The accused then demanded a bribe of Rs 5 lakh for not adding the name of the firm owner in the FIR. Later, the bribe amount was said to be Rs 1.3 lakh," said a senior official of Gujarat ACB.

"After the travel company staff spoke to his owner, the latter paid the inspector Rs 1,70,000 which was then handed over to the accused police officer through Jaiuddin Salyed on August 1. The accused officer then demanded the remaining Rs 1,30,000. It was then that the travel company staff approached the ACB and a trap was set," the official added.

Bajrang Dal threat, school calls off kindergarten field trip to mosque in Vadodara

A PRIVATE school, which had planned a field trip for kindergarten children to a mosque in Vadodara, called off the visit after protest from Bajrang Dal Tuesday. Volunteers of the Bajrang Dal, who claimed to have "received complaints" from parents, arrived at the school and threatened the management with dire consequences if the children were taken to the mosque.

Kalati-based Delhi Public School, which had earlier taken children for a temple visit in the city, had planned to take the kindergarten children to a mosque as part of a field visit for value education this week. However, volunteers of the Bajrang Dal arrived on campus Tuesday and staged a protest, chanting the Ram Dhun.

Later, they met the Principal and "warned" of agitation if the mosque visit was not called off. "We have asked the Principal to call off this field trip to the mosque. There is no need to mix religion with education. They can show many places of worship using virtual technology. We have left it to the Principal saying he should consider he would not want his school to earn a bad name in the name of religion. We have come here after receiving complaints from the parents. We will also return on the designated

day when the mosque trip is scheduled. If we see that they have not complied, we are prepared for an agitation," said Ketan Trivedi, Bajrang Dal President in Vadodara. When contacted, Principal AK Sinha told this newspaper that he had met volunteers of the protesting group and students' safety was the school's top priority. "As of now, all field trips organised by the school in August stand cancelled," Sinha said.

Last week, the school had issued a consent form to parents seeking voluntary permission for the children's mosque visit. The school said that all parents who agreed to send their wards on the field trip had returned the form. It is so disheartening that some fringe groups are protesting over issues that should be between parents and the school only," said a parent of a kindergarten student.

Valsad: 2 minor siblings die after eating stale food

TWO MINOR siblings aged five and three died due to food poisoning at Kaporada taluka of Valsad Monday. The deceased, identified as Chandini (5) and Asvanti (3) consumed stale food along with their siblings Meera (17), Sanjay (13) who are hospitalised.

Police said that all the four children consumed stale food for dinner Sunday and later developed stomach ache. Following this, Chandini and Asvanti fell unconscious and their father Devraj Mura informed the village sarpanch about the incident.

Devraj and his wife Sulliben Mora works as farm labourers. The children were taken to nearby Sutharpada Community health

centre where Chandini and Asvanti were declared dead. The condition of Meera and Sanjay is reported to be stable.

Sulliben said, "On Sunday evening, I made dal and rice for dinner and served it to our children and we slept empty stomach. The food was one-day old. Later both my daughters started vomiting. There was no vehicle to take the children to hospital, which is around 10 kilometers away. On Monday at 6:00 am, we initiated the village sarpanch and took the children to the community health centre where doctors declared Asvanti and Chandini brought dead. The condition of Sanjay and Meera condition is stable."

Kaporada Police Inspector H P Gamit said, "We have lodged a case of accidental death and started probe."
